

PREFACE TO THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE 37th Ontario Waste Management Conference

On behalf of the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, and the Conference Planning and Program Committees, our thanks and appreciation to those who registered for the annual Ontario Waste Management Conference. The attendance at the 37th session was 410.

The general consensus of those attending the Conference was that the format introduced last year, more papers and longer sessions, was again successful. The authors and the session moderators contributed significantly to this success, along with the efforts of the members of the Planning and Program Committees as well as the representatives from the Pollution Control Association of Ontario and the Air and Waste Management Association.
